#### LESSON # 4 TITLE - GIVING UP LESSER THINGS TO GAIN MUCH BETTER THINGS

The news media continually shares examples of people who do <u>not</u> observe Jesus' admonition in Matthew 16:25-27 Mateo Matthieu 马太福音

"For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it. For what is a man profited, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul? For the Son of man shall come in the glory of his Father with his angels; and then he shall reward every man according to his works."

But for God's mercy, that scripture might have become Jacob's epithet. Jacob started out wrong, but made several "course-corrections" during his time on earth. As you study this lesson, vow to go forward making choices that please God alone, without yielding to family or societal pressures and expectations.

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If you choose to ignore the legacy of Jacob, and "grab all the gusto", and you might end up assembled with the goats, on Jesus' left hand!!! Preview Matthew 25:31-33 Mateo Matthieu 马太福音


- 1) Consider Genesis Chapter 35 the "Take-2" in Jacob's return journey. God spared Jacob the wrath of Esau, but that was not God's entire deliverable. What more was required of Jacob in Genesis 35:1-4?
- 2) What was the confirmation in Genesis 35:5? Compare/contrast Genesis 32:1-2.

3) Highlight "...and the terror of God was upon the cities" Genesis 35:5. As you complete your study of the entire Bible, be sure to notate similar miraculous protections of God.



4) Genesis 35:7 indicates that Jacob "...built an altar there". Locate all the occasions when God appeared before Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and when each of them built altars.

That summation will result in its own independent Bible study!



5) Why was it necessary for God to remind Jacob of his new name? Compare/contrast Genesis 35:10 and Genesis 32:28.

6) **OBSERVATION:** Might Rachel's plight have been avoided if Jacob had not continued journeying? Study Genesis 35:16-20.

**OBSERVATION:** When a child's birth is associated with the mother's death, too often that child is blamed, shamed, resented, or even hated by its father, siblings, and other family members. Praise God, that was not the experience of Benjamin! Benjamin was loved and cherished by Jacob, Joseph, and all of his other brothers. That is God's role model and "best practice" in similar heart-breaking situations.

Preview Genesis 42:34-38, 43:29-34, and Chapter 44, for confirmation of the entire family's devotion to Benjamin.



5) God changed Jacob's name to Israel in Genesis 32:28 and 35:10. Over time, the descendants of Jacob became known as the nation of Israel.

Exodus Chapters 12 and 13 serve as a "sneak preview" to the Book of Leviticus.

Exodus Chapter 12 introduces the preparation for Passover, the feast of unleavened bread, and various Do' and Don'ts. Levítico 利未记
